### Introduction

The Department of English Language and Literature enjoys the distinction of being the oldest Post-graduate Department of English in the country. Established in 1873, it predates its sister departments at Oxford and Cambridge and has had a long list of prominent teachers and students to its credit, which includes Allama Muhammad Iqbal, Prof. Ahmed Shah Patras Bokhari, Prof. Sirajuddin, Khawaja Manzoor Hussain, Dr. Imdad Hussain, and Faiz Ahmed Faiz. The Department was at first affiliated with Calcutta University and later with the University of the Punjab. English is acknowledged worldwide as the sole medium of international communication and information. The various programmes offered by the Department aim to produce empowered learners with strong oral and written skills that will help them fulfill their economic and sociocultural needs. Moreover, these programmes are designed to inculcate a creative, analytical and reflective bend of mind, which will enable students to think independently and critically.
