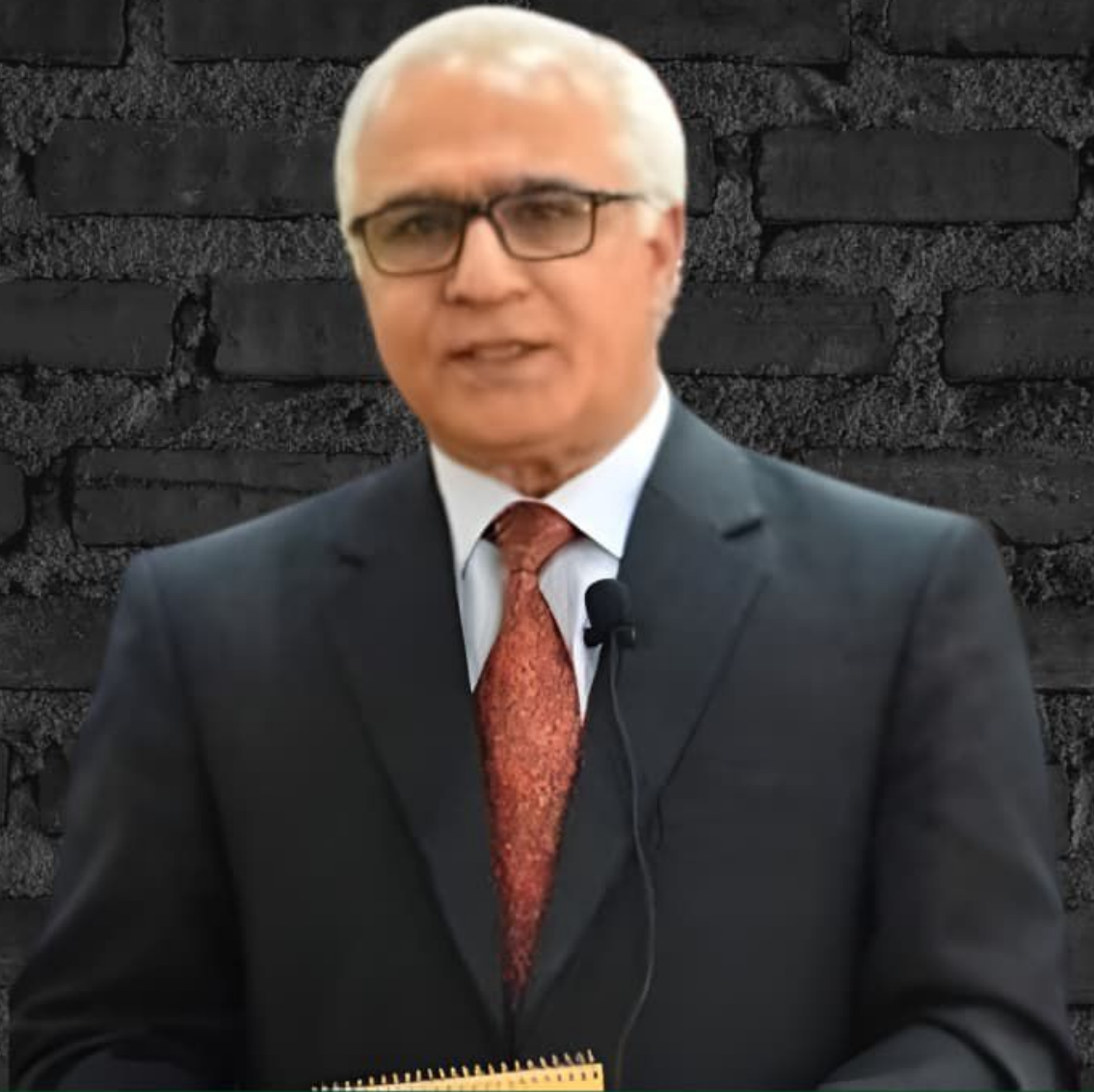

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Tahir Ali Sadiq

Tahir Ali Sadiq (b. 1989) is a Lahore-based visual artist with a Master's in Visual Arts (2023) and BFA in Miniature Painting (2012) from National College of Arts Lahore. Recipient of the Governor Punjab Award (2021) and Haji Sharif Prize, his works are part of notable collections including those of Michael Houlgate, Salima Hashmi, and Imran Qureshi. He has contributed to the MAKTAB initiative and the Lahore Biennale Foundation (2018). Sadiq's practice reimagines Western art through South Asian miniature techniques, exploring historical, social, and personal narratives. Inspired by Ottoman-Timurid-Persian manuscript traditions, he employs an unfinished aesthetic that reflects historical gaps and invites continual artistic evolution.



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Dr. Zahid Iqbal

Dr. Zahid Iqbal serves as Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of English at The University of Lahore, where he teaches Postcolonial Theory and contemporary Anglophone literatures. His research has been featured in several national and international journals, including *New Horizons*, *Alhikmat: A Journal of Philosophy*, *Intersections: Gender and Sexuality in Asia and the Pacific*, and *SAGE Open*. Known for his insightful engagement with postcolonial discourse and modern literary studies, Dr. Iqbal continues to contribute to academic research and leadership in English literature and critical theory.



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Prof. Dr. Muhammad Asif

Professor of English & Director of General Education at Akhuwat College University, Kasur, and Principal Consultant at Transparent Language (USA).

He is a distinguished scholar devoted to transforming English language teaching through innovation and technology. A former Fulbright FLTA at the University of Wisconsin–Madison, he has served as a Research Scholar at Michigan State University, Trainer with LearnLight (Netherlands), and Deputy Examiner for the International Baccalaureate (Cardiff, UK). His research focuses on learning technologies, the metaverse, web-based language learning platforms, and English language education. He has published extensively in these areas, reflecting his broad academic engagement and lasting contributions to the field.



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Dr. Faisal Nazir

Dr Faisal Nazir is an Assistant Professor of English at the Department of English, University of Karachi where he teaches Literary Theory and Criticism, Postcolonial Literature, World Literature, and Literary Pedagogy. He is the author of *Orientalism Post 9/11: Pakistani Anglophone Fiction in an Age of Terror* (2020), a critically acclaimed book in academic circles that critiques postcolonial theory and literature for adopting orientalist frames in representing religious identities. He has contributed chapters to *Routledge Companion to Pakistani Anglophone Writing* (2019), *Narratives of Trauma in South Asian Literature* (2023) and *Literature and the War on Terror* (2023). His publications include critical work published in local and international journals, as well as poetry published in local and national anthologies.



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Prof. Dr. Taimur Kayani

Prof. Dr. Taimur Kayani is a distinguished academic specializing in English literature, drama, and film studies. He holds a PhD in English Literature from Universiti Putra Malaysia and serves as a Professor, Head of the English Department, and Dean of Open and Distance Learning at GIFT University, Pakistan. Dr. Kayani is also the founding Director of the GIFT Language Centre. An accomplished playwright, director, and researcher, he integrates theatre and film into language teaching and has showcased his work at international festivals. His research focuses on translation, adaptation, scriptwriting, and film production. He actively engages with the public through social media, promoting theatre as a transformative tool.



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Prof. Dr. Ghulam Murtaza

Chairperson, Department of English Literature, GC University, Faisalabad. A distinguished scholar and poet, he introduced *Proemistry*, a postmodern fusion of poetry and prose. Serving at FCCU since 2005, she holds a PhD in English Language and Literature from the University of the Punjab, with research on Men as Victims of Violence in Partition Fiction. Her academic interests include Masculinity Studies, South Asian Literature, and Digital Literary studies. She has organized major international conferences and literary festivals and is an active researcher and speaker with numerous publications and keynote addresses to her credit.



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Prof. Dr. Tahir Saleem

Dr. Tahir Saleem, Professor and Head of the Department of English at the University of Central Punjab, Lahore, earned his PhD in Linguistics and Literature from Air University, Islamabad. A leading scholar in applied linguistics, morphosyntax, multilingualism, and technology-enhanced language pedagogy, he has published 29 research articles in Web of Science-indexed journals. Recognized as the only linguist in Pakistan's Arts and Humanities with an H-Index of 8, his work spans Urdu compounding, Pashto morphosyntax, and AI integration in ESL classrooms, appearing in journals such as PLOS ONE and International Journal of Multilingualism. As a doctoral supervisor and academic leader, he shapes research that bridges theory and practice while addressing Pakistan's multilingual realities.



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Prof. Dr. Zafar Iqbal Bhatti

Professor & Head, School of English, and Founding Director of the Corpus Research Center (CRC) at Minhaj University Lahore. A leading scholar in Applied Linguistics and Corpus Studies, he earned his PhD from UMT and has served as Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the International Research Institute (IRI), International Islamic University Islamabad, and Research Fellow (2025) at INTI International University, Malaysia. As the pioneer behind Pakistan's first dedicated Corpus Research Center—established in collaboration with Shanghai International Studies University—Dr. Bhatti has authored over 120 research papers in international and HEC-recognized journals. Editor-in-Chief of JACOR and recipient of the Research Excellence Awards (2023 & 2024), he continues to advance corpus-based linguistic research and foster international academic collaboration.



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Dr. Amara Khan

Associate Professor of English at Lahore College for Women University and an alumna of Government College University, Lahore. A scholar of gender and cultural resistance, she works at the intersections of literature, pedagogy, and public humanities. Her research explores ecological approaches to language and identity, with a focus on South Asian adaptations, theatre, and media. A recipient of the Roll of Honour in Dramatics from GCU, she has also delivered invited talks at the University of Leeds, UK. Her work bridges academic inquiry with cultural agency, education, and social justice.



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Dr. Saleem Khan

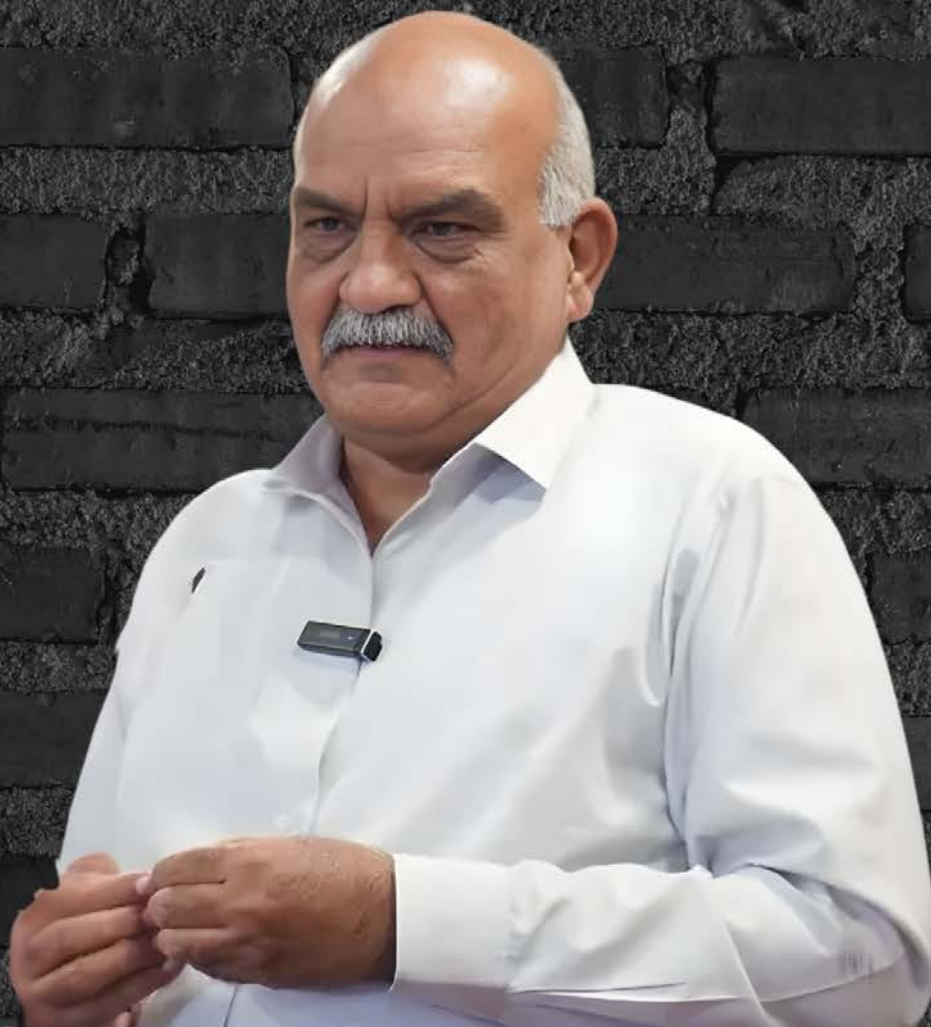


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Dr. Muhammad Asif

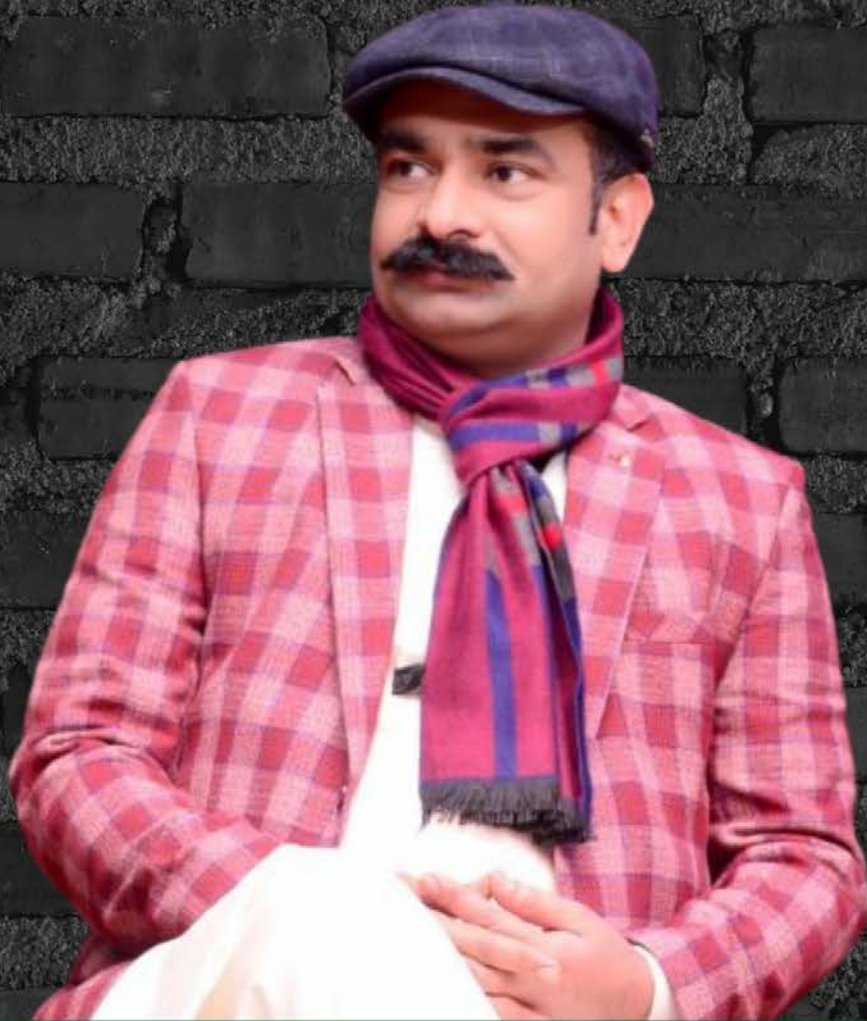
