Position Holders Honoured

The world is changing and now there are many other promising fields, careers for young students beyond medical and engineering, said the Vice Chancellor GCU Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah while addressing a ceremony, organized by the university's Directorate of Intermediate Studies, in honour of their Intermediate positions holders at the Bokhari Auditorium.

The Vice Chancellor said intermediate program was the pride of GCU, and it's the only government institute in the province which had consistently shown tremendous results in the Lahore Board Intermediate Examinations over the last three decades. He congratulated the Ravians for showing tremendous results in Inter exams 2017-18, saying that "students' success and achievements were the source of glory to their institutions."

The Controller of Examinations GCU said that besides seven positions, a record number of 577 students of GCU secured A+ grade while pass percentage was 94.78 percent against 63.61 percent of Lahore Board. She mentioned that it was due to the students' unflinching commitment to their studies as well as the invaluable pedagogical input of the experienced and qualified teachers that Ravians had been consistently securing positions in the Intermediate results for the last three decades. Later, the Vice Chancellor awarded cash prizes to the position holders of GCU.

GCU Celebrated Kuldip Nayar's Vision for Peace

A seminar was held at GCU to celebrate the late veteran Indian journalist Kuldip Nayar's vision for peace. Ms. Mandira Nayar, Kuldip's granddaughter and also a journalist, chaired the seminar and later planted a "peace tree" in his grandfather's name at the Shahab Gardens.

Mr. I.A. Rehman, President, Human Rights Commission of Pakistan said that the vision for peace as perceived by Kuldip and many other eminent people on both sides is the only way forward for India and Pakistan. The price, which the people of South Asia have paid for confrontation between the two neighbouring countries, is enormous and one cannot even calculate it. There are differences and disputes between the India and Pakistan but they need to be resolved through peaceful dialogues.

Ms. Mandira got very emotional, saying that her grandfather spent his entire life preaching peace and friendship between India and Pakistan but his beautiful vision could not be realized in his lifetime. She said that every year, her grandfather went to Wahga border and walked up to the iron gates and lit candles, wishing that one-day this light of peace would spread over both the countries. She said that GC was the place where her grandfather was introduced to politics by the leadership of Democratic Student's Federation.

Mr. Imtiaz Alam, Secretary-General SAFMA said that it's very heart-breaking if one talks for peace in India and Pakistan, one's patriotism is doubted, and people like Kuldip Nayar were the voice of their own conscience but they were called agents and candle mafias. Despite the violent partition, he had not seen resentment in Nayar's generation at both sides. They always had a great love for the places where they were born. They were a buffer zone between India and Pakistan by never leaving their peace agenda.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU said that this seminar was a great opportunity to learn about great people like Kuldip Nayar. Peace, harmony and friendship; no matter how illusive they might be when it came to India and Pakistan, but in the times of turbulence and tension, there had been few individuals who didn't waiver and whose faith in restoration of peace remained a guiding light for all those who subscribed to the notion of humanity, peace and tranquillity.

Eminent writer Prof. Dr. Saadat Saeed said that this world was not primarily for the countries but for mankind. Mr. Siddique Awan, in charge Department of English also addressed the seminar.



Breast Cancer Awareness Seminar Organized at GCU



The seminar was organised by the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) at GCU in collaboration with the Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital and Research Centre (SKMCH&RC). Speakers at the seminar urged the young girls to adopt a healthy and active lifestyle, saying that there is frightening increase in the ratio of breast cancer in young girls in Pakistan due to inappropriate diet and unhealthy lifestyles.

Dr. Nimrah Nadeem, Clinical Oncologist said that the situation is getting more and more critical every year, and only key to survival from this fatal disease is

early detection. She mentioned that every woman was at risk of developing breast cancer irrespective of class or creed but the factor that put some women at greater risk is family history of breast cancer, inappropriate diet and inactive lifestyle. She said one in every 9 women was diagnosed with breast cancer. She advised students to exercise for 30 minutes daily, maintain a balanced diet full of antioxidants i.e. vegetables, fruits, whole grains, nuts, green tea, and fish, avoid smoking, drugs, alcohol consumption and hormone replacement therapies. The clinical oncologist also briefed the students about the signs and symptoms of breast cancer and methods of self-examination, saying they must be mindful of any changes in their breast and armpit areas. She dispelled the impression that cancer was spread by sharing clothes, direct contact with patients, caffeine, mobile phone or by the microwaves.

Ms. Iram Sohail, the Director QEC said that the month of October was marked in countries across the world as breast cancer awareness month for early detection and treatment. She said that currently there was not sufficient knowledge of breast cancer in Pakistan; therefore, more awareness campaigns were needed to be launched for this purpose at national level. She asked the students to work as volunteers in their families to raise awareness among their female family members. She believed that the breast cancer was not fatal; rather it was ignorance which made it fatal. Early detection can result in survival rate of 98 percent.

Later, the Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah presented shields and souvenirs to the speakers of the seminar which was also attended by Mr. Masrur Lodhi Regional Manager SKMCH&RC.



GCU and Applied Socio-Economic Resource Centre (ASR) signed MoU

The Applied Socio-Economic Resource Centre (ASR), a reputed NGO, donated their 35-year-old library to the Government College University Lahore for promotion of research in social sciences especially women and gender studies. Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, Vice Chancellor and Ms. Nighat Khan Executive Director ASR signed an accord for the transfer of library, at a ceremony organized by the Directorate of Academic Planning & External Links at the University's Meeting Rooms. The university's academic heads and the senior management of ASR were also present.

The donated library contains more than 15,000 books, journals, theses, and 800 volumes of media reports on different issues including human rights violations. These are estimated to be more than 0.3 million news clippings. The library also contained video lectures of eminent foreign social scientists on a wide range of subjects.

Ms. Nighat Khan said that they had set up this library in 1983 for pure research and academic purposes at the ASR's Institute of Women's Studies, Lahore. No activism could stand alone until one researches about it and academically study its various dimensions. She stated that different universities requested them for this library but they felt most comfortable with this historic institution which had produced eminent luminaries in almost all fields of life. She hoped that GCU would also set up the Women and Gender Studies Department soon and this donated library would be a great resource for it. She also briefed the university's faculty about the working of ASR and their research projects in Pakistan.

The Vice Chancellor expressed gratitude to the ASR management, saying that this was one of the finest book collection donated to GCU in the last many decades. As per MoU, the ASR and GCU have also agreed to hold joint seminars, conferences and workshops.

GCU Cascades In-Service Training for Newly Inducted Faculty Members

A five-day training workshop on pedagogy and other soft skills, stress management and emotional intelligence was held at Government College in University Lahore for the university's young faculty members organized by Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC).

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor addressed the concluding ceremony and said that teachers' early career anxieties often led to students' feeling overloaded, hence these trainings were crucial to equip them with the latest pedagogical skills. The Vice Chancellor reflected on the importance of centrality of the teacher. He believed that a teacher should be a likeable person and should be just and fair in classroom. He asked the young faculty to encourage questioning by their students. Prof. Shah stated that learning was a lifelong process, so even senior teachers should not hesitate attending these training. I learn so many new things whenever I go to such trainings, seminars or attend conferences.

Ms. Iram Sohail, Director QEC highlighted the topics which were covered during five days including communication skills, critical thinking, learners' psychology, essentials of English language usage and microteaching. She expressed gratitude to the resource persons; Dr. Sobia Tahir, Malik Umair Ahmad, Ms. Amna Anwar, Dr. Shahida Batool, Dr. Syeda Salma Hassan. Ms. Sidra Farid and Ms. Afia Mehmood for wonderfully conducting the sessions. She appreciated the coordinators of the cascading workshop. Later, the Vice Chancellor awarded the certificates to the participants of the workshop.



GCU, Bartin University Signed MoU on Research Project

The Government College University Lahore signed a collaborative research project with Bartin University, Turkey for the cost effective production of bioethanol. The Council General of Turkey Mr. Emir Ozbey chaired the launching ceremony and awareness seminar of the research project at the Bukhari Auditorium, GCU. The research project, to be funded by the Higher Education Commission, Pakistan and Council of Higher Education, Turkey, also included PhD students exchange programme between both the universities.

Prof. Dr. Ahmet Karadag, Dean of Science Bartin University said that Turkey and Pakistan are currently importing 95% of their energy requirement and had not yet put full efforts in the production of more sustainable energy. He mentioned that Turkey is far behind in the world ranking for bioethanol production which is one of the most important renewable energy sources. Prof Ahmet, who is also Principal Investigator of the research project from Turkey stated that the project aimed to introduce a more economic and efficient way of producing bioethanol, which was an alternative eco-friendly strategic energy source with high combustion efficiency. The ultimate goal of this project is to develop a process for fourth generation bioethanol production both in Turkey and Pakistan.

Mr. Ozbey laid stress on more research collaborations between the universities of Pakistan and Turkey, saying said that both the friendly countries were facing similar problems and scientists of both countries should join hands in solving them. He congratulated the principal investigators of the project for securing three-year research grant.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU said that Pakistan was facing severe energy crisis and it needed to move forward quickly to find a quick replacement of fossil fuels. He sincerely hoped that the successful completion of this project would contribute greatly to the economies of both countries.

Dr. Nauman Aftab the Principal Investigator of the project from Pakistan said that solar and wind energy projects are not feasible for a country like Pakistan because they required huge investments for heavy installations and huge storage devises. He stated that we must pay serious attention on mass scale production of renewable energy in the form of biofuel. Dr. Aftab said that this project would be for three years and each year one PhD student of GCU would go to Bartin University, Turkey for a period of two months. Similarly, three PhD students from Bartin University will also come to GCU in three years. Dr Ikram-ul-Haq, Prof Emeritus GCU also addressed the project launching ceremony.

Pink Ribbon Day Observed at GCU

An on-campus Awareness Walk was held at Government College University (GCU) Lahore in collaboration with the Pink Ribbon Pakistan to eliminate social stigmas attached to the breast cancer which if detected at early stages can be cured.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah Vice Chancellor GCU, Mr. Saboor Ahmad Khan Registrar, Ms. Iram Sohail Director Quality Enhancement Cell and Mr. Yousaf Bashir Director Facilities led the walk from the University's Clock Tower to the Girls Cafeteria to raise breast cancer awareness among students.

The Director QEC said that it is very unfortunate that it is still considered a taboo for girls in most parts of our society to talk about this cancer which affects every one of nine women in the society. Even, girls are reluctant to talking to their mothers and doctors about such diseases that is why there is dire need of awareness campaigns on a massive scale.

The Vice Chancellor said that GCU organised scores of such events throughout the year to enlighten students, with the knowledge about the health issues and techniques to adopt an active and healthy lifestyle. He mentioned that the university would also decorate its historical building with the pink lights for the mass awareness about the Pink Ribbon Drive. Later, awareness pamphlets and brochures were also distributed among students to educate them about the symptoms of the diseases, early detection methods, and treatment for the breast carcinoma.





GCU Launched Smog Awareness Drive

The Government College University Lahore Environment Protection Society (EPS) launched the Smog Awareness Drive in different parts of the city. Besides holding different on-campus activities and door-to-door campaigns in their areas, the members of GCU-EPS also distributed pamphlets and face-masks among the food-sellers, motorcyclists and pedestrians at the Minar-e-Pakistan in collaboration with the Albayrak Waste Management Company.

The EPS volunteers informed people about the precautionary measures which must be adopted to minimize harmful health impacts of smog. Dr. Faiza Sharif Advisor-EPS said that the government, civil society and educational institutions must beef up

their efforts for raising awareness among people about this environmental pollution. She mentioned that smog is harmful to human lungs and causes respiratory and cardiovascular illnesses. It aggravates heart problems, bronchitis, asthma, and even reduce lungs function in healthy people. She requested the people to use masks, avoid unnecessary outdoor & smoke emitting activities and plant maximum trees in their surroundings.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU appreciated for participation of GCU-EPS students in the Smog Awareness Drives, saying that every citizen must play its role for Clean and Green Pakistan.

GCU Lahore Signed Two Accords with CTGU

The Government College University Lahore signed two agreements and a memorandum of understanding with the China Three Gorges University (CTGU), Yichang. Prof. Dr. Khalid Manzoor Butt, Chairperson Department of Political Science, and Dr. Huang Yinping, Vice President CTGU, signed the agreements during the former's visit to China to attend the President's Forum of South-Asian-Hubei Universities Alliance hosted by the Chinese government.

According to MoU, twenty Chinese students would attend the Winter School at GCU Lahore for three weeks for the next five years. The students will study the subjects like Pakistan Studies, Pak-China Relations and English. Each Chinese student would pay \$ 180 to GCU Lahore for attending this winter school. Both the Universities also agreed to exchange six students and one teacher every year for a period of five months besides holding joint conferences, training workshops and seminars. Prof. Butt stated that CTGU had also signed two important agreements with GCU for promotion of Pakistan Studies in China and China Studies in Pakistan to bridge the cultural and language barriers between the two friendly nations.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU said that social and cultural integration of two friendly nations was highly crucial for the success of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. He stressed the dire need to enhance the academic and research collaborations between the universities of China and Pakistan. The Vice Chancellor requested the governments of both countries to fund these universities' collaborations. He appreciated that GCU was the first public sector University of Pakistan who had joined the South-Asian-Hubei Universities Alliance which aimed at strengthening cultural exchanges among the countries along the Belt and Road, and promoting education and scientific researches. About 27 top South Asian Universities have become member of this prestigious alliance.

International Conference on Human Rights Organized at GCU

A three-day international conference on "Human Rights Challenges and Prospects", was held at Government College University Lahore to analyze new researched data, concepts, approaches, ideas and methods vis-à-vis human rights and formulate a more constructive framework to revert the aforesaid daunting trends.

A total of 72 research papers were presented during six technical sessions of the conference that debated upon Women Empowerment, Social Justice, Minority Rights, Transgender's search for identity and Security, Peace and Human Rights vulnerabilities in the South Asia. More than 33 social scientists from different universities of Pakistan and 11 foreign scholars including Pakistan Research Centre, Honder College of IMNU, China Director Prof. Tang Jun, Prof. Zulkhumor Mirzaeva from Uzbekistan, Dr. Tamás Lattmann from Hungry, Dr. Norehabinti Hashim from Malaysia, Dr. Bilveer Singh from Singapore and Mr. Jeff Barnes from University of Akron, Ohio, USA also participated in the policy dialogue. Speakers at the conference said that it is time for the voices of reason and responsibility in the world to caution against militarism and demand strict adherence by all states, large and small, to the UN Charter's central principle: the prohibition of the use or threat of use of force in international relations.

Mr. Shamshad Ahmad Khan, former foreign secretary and veteran Pakistani diplomat said that in the emerging scenario, no other region in the world today was as volatile and unstable as South Asia with continuing Afghan turmoil with all its ramifications and longstanding India-Pakistan conflict and hostility. He also talked about the growing challenges of human rights globally particularly of children and women. The veteran diplomat mentioned that the human rights challenges were many, but the prospects are sovery bleak.

Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nizamuddin, Chairman Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC), chief guest at the opening ceremony, said that the world had agreed charters on human rights but it needed practical solutions to implement them. He laid a stress on academia to debate and formulate practical solutions and polices to counter the

abuse of human rights in global and domestic perspectives.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU said that the themes of GCU's conference were mostly related to vulnerable segments of the society, not only in Pakistan but in global perspective. The conference seeks to explore economic, political and social dimensions of Human Rights, covering a wide range of concerns of different stakeholders. The scholars shed light on the topics beyond the traditional parameters of academic discussions and contribute in formulation of methodological framework that must comprehend the concept of Human Rights within the context of local and global realities and real international politics.

Prof. Dr. Khalid Manzoor Butt, conference chairman said that the social activists from John Locke to Asma Jehangir had strived to educate the people about their Rights and to sensitise the stakeholders. He mentioned that Kashmir, Palestine and Rohangia Muslims of Miyanmar were prime examples of Human Rights violations and international community was unable to address these challenging issues of contemporary age. Similarly, minorities and immigrants have been suffering in many countries. Prof. Butt pointed out that the post-modern societal norms demanded more in-depth insight and emphatic understanding of human behaviors in day-to-day social interaction.

Mr. I.A. Rehman, President Human Rights Commission of Pakistan chaired a policy dialogue at the concluding session which was also addressed by eminent political scientist Prof. Sajjad Naseer and historian Dr. Farhat Mahmud. Mr. Rehman called for provision of basic human rights to people of all social, religious and cultural strata. Later, Punjab Minister for Higher Education Raja Yasir Humayun Sarfraz chaired the concluding session of the conference which was followed by a music concert for the foreign delegates. Eminent nuclear scientist Dr. Samar Mubarakmand and Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah also addressed the session.



GCU Department of Philosophy Turned 150

The Department of Philosophy at GCU turned 150. A large number of students, old ravians and faculty members of the department participated in an on-campus colourful and jubilant walk, led by Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor to mark the sesquicentennial anniversary of the oldest Department of Philosophy in the entire South Asia. Eminent writer Mirza Athar Baig also participated in the walk which was embellished by pigeons, balloons, rose-petals and placards on which various slogans were written.

Dr. Sobia Tahir, Chairperson Department of Philosophy said that the department was established in the Government College Lahore in 1868 and it cherished the rare distinction of being the oldest seat of Philosophical learning in the subcontinent. It was in this prestigious department the Poet-Philosopher Allama Mohammad Iqbal was a student and later a teacher.

Dr. Sobia said since the beginning, eminent thinkers and teachers like Professor Bell, B.E. Ussher, Lala Jiya Raam, Thomas W. Arnold, George Sidney Brett, Professor Noor Ilahi, A. W. James, J.H. Harley, Dr. Muhammad Iqbal, L.P. Saunders and G.C. Chatter had remained associated with the department which started its postgraduate classes immediately after its inception. She mentioned that after the creation of Pakistan in 1947, the Muslim thinkers and scholars immediately filled the gap of the

eminent British and Hindu academics without the slightest difficulty or breach. The shining stars of academic horizon who illuminated the Department with their erudition are no less than Professor Qazi Mohammad Aslam, Professor Hamid ud Din, Professor Mohammad Saeed Sheikh, Professor Shahid Hussain, Dr. Mohammad Tufail Salik, Professor Mirza Athar Baig and Professor Azam Khan.

The Vice Chancellor said that during its long history, the Department had continued to be one of the most important centres of philosophical learning in South Asia, especially noted for the promotion of the spirit of free inquiry and critical thinking. The Department has made significant contribution to the promotion of liberal values in the University and Pakistan.

Prof. Baig said that it was an acknowledgment of the advanced and superior educational standard of Punjab in general and of Lahore in particular in the late 1860s that a higher department of an elegant and refined discipline was established there. He also remembered that the Department started its research journal, Quest, in 1993 which is being published regularly.

GCU Delegation Visits Iqbal's Mausoleum

A delegation of students and teachers from Government College University Lahore, led by Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, visited the Allama Iqbal's mausoleum to pay homage to the great Old Ravian, philosopher and Poet of the East on his 141th birth anniversary. The office-bearers of GCU Rovers Club and Majlis-e-Iqbal were also present.

Later, The Vice Chancellor offered fateha for the soul of the great national poet and laid floral wreath. He also recorded his views in the visitors' book.



International Conference on Mathematics held at GCU

An international conference on Mathematics and its Applications was organized at Government College University Lahore to provide a platform to scientists, industrial professionals and academicians to exchange ideas and present their latest research in the field of Mathematical Sciences. Besides 61 national scientists and research scholars, 11 foreign scientists from USA, South Africa, Turkey and Thailand also presented their papers at the conference. The three day conference was organized by the Department of Mathematics in collaboration with the Federal and Provincial Higher Education Commissions. GCU, Pretoria University Signed MoU for Research Collaboration

The Government College University, Lahore and University of Pretoria, South Africa signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for student and faculty exchange and research collaboration in the field of Mathematics.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU and Prof. Dr. Roumen Anguelov, Chairperson Department of Mathematics, University of Pretoria singed the 22-point accord at a ceremony organized by the Directorate of Academic Planning and External Links (AP&EL) at the University's Syndicate Committee Room. Prof. Shah said that GCU was actively strengthening research and academic ties with foreign universities for research collaboration, training of faculty members and exchange of students at postgraduate level. Mr. Saboor Ahmed Khan Registrar GCU and Prof. Dr. Mujahid Abbas Chairperson Department of Mathematics also attended the MoU signing ceremony.

Russian Envoy Addresses GCU Students on Geopolitics

Mr. Alexey Yurivich Dedov, Russian Ambassador to Pakistan addressed the students of Government College University Lahore on geopolitics and new trends in Pak-Russia relations.

The ambassador highlighted the ongoing technical and economic cooperation of Russia in several projects in Pakistan especially gas pipeline via Iran to Pakistan, saying that Moscow looked forward to having strong economic relationship with Pakistan. He highlighted that Russia and Pakistan were holding joint military exercises which were focused on counter terrorism training.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor attended the talk organized by the university's Quaid-e-Azam Political Science Society at the Fazl-i-Hussain Reading Room. The invited talk was followed by an hour-long interactive question-answers session. In reply to a question by a student, the Russian envoy said that they granted more visas to Pakistanis this year than previous years. He also told students that there was a handsome population of Muslims in Moscow and some other areas of Russia. The Russian ambassador also answered questions by students referring to Russian influence in regional politics especially its role in Indo-Pak relations.

Talking to the ambassador, the Vice Chancellor highlighted the issue of limited scholarships for Pakistani students in Russia. He also laid stress on enhancing academic and research collaboration between universities of both countries. Later, the ambassador visited different areas of the campus and admired the gothic architecture and green landscape of GCU building.



Tribute Paid to Allama labal

The seminar was held in connection with 150 years celebrations of the university's Department of Philosophy on "Reconstruction of Religious Thought in Islam". Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU chaired the seminar. Prof. Abdul Khaliq highlighted that Iqbal's thought still had unexplored avenues which may be, rather, must be elucidated by young scholars and researchers.

Similarly, the consumption is also very low, approximately 2.2kg per capita as compared to the rest of the world where it is 19kg per capita.

Qaim to honor his 15 years outstanding honorary academic and research services to the university. The friends, colleagues and the wife of Prof. Qaim were also present on this occasion.

The Vice Chancellor said that Prof. Qaim was a pride of Pakistan as well as for GCU. He admired his remarkable dedication towards producing PhDs in nuclear physics at GCU. He mentioned that during the last 15 years, with his support a small Nuclear Data Group was established at GCU which had got international recognition. A big push from his side, made it possible that International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), included GCU in a Co-ordinated Research Project (CRP). The five years long project has been completed successfully and GCU can now be seen at the landscape of International Nuclear Science.

Prof. Dr. N.M Butt, the nuclear physicist mentioned that Prof. Qaimis highly decorated scientist, a long list of medals and fellowships are on his credit. In the field of radioactivity, the most celebrated medals are JARI Medal, Hevesy Medal and Becquerel Medal and all the three prestigious medals have already been conferred to Prof. Qaim. He is the fellow of many international societies and science academies. He has been awarded Sitara-i-Imtiaz by the President of Pakistan for his services to the cause of Science in Pakistan in 1999.

Dr. G. Murtaza, Salam Chair Professor, shared his college days' memories with Prof. Qiam when they were both students. Prof. Dr. Raiz Ahmad, Dean Faculty of Engineering also addressed the ceremony.

Three-Day International Conference on Plant Sciences organized at GCU

A three-day international conference on plant sciences held at Government College University Lahore under the auspices of Botany Department and Higher Education Commission. Prof. Dr. Kauser Abdulla Malik, eminent biologist was the chief guest at the inaugural ceremony. The conference was also attended by the foreign delegates from China, Germany, Canada and USA. Dr. Mirza, the conference chairman told the participants that the aim of the conference was to provide a forum to discuss practical challenges encountered and seek research collaborations among universities and institutes to proceed towards promising new developments in the different areas of plant sciences.

Prof. Dr. Kauser Abdullah Malik said that Pakistan direly needed the focused research for self-reliance in different walks of life. In this context, our scientists and students must avail this opportunity of sharing new knowledge regarding different fields of plant science to set targets for improvements in quality of research.

Prof. Dr. Islam Ullah Khan, Dean Faculty of Science & Technology GCU said that the planet's water resources are under immense pressure, the amount of fresh water available per person has decreased four times in the last 60 years and of the water that is available, 70% was already being used for agriculture. Thus, agricultural production must be intensified to feed more people with less water on the same amount of land. He mentioned that the pathogens that caused devastating crop losses continued to spread in the face of increased global commerce and climate change. Given these challenges, there is a pressing need for plant research to produce solutions to ensure food security in a sustainable and safe way.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor highlighted the need for development of basic plant research discoveries into technologies or approaches that improved agriculture. He said that modern research was complex and multidisciplinary and it was not possible for a single university to possess all the knowledge and equipment. Therefore, it was imperative to establish academic and research links and share resources, expertise and equipment with each other. The Vice Chancellor also highlighted that there was a lot of hunger even in developed countries where a large section of society could not afford food. He laid stress on strong collaborations among scientists at the national and international level to fight the threat of food insecurity.

Professor Emeritus Dr. Khalid Hameed Sheikh, the former Vice Chancellor of Punjab University, was the chief guest at the concluding ceremony which was also addressed by the Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah and foreign delegates from Canada and Nigeria. Prof. Khalid said that there was a dire need to explore the botany related fields at the micro and nano level. He mentioned that the technical advances in the subject such as genome editing and metabolic engineering exemplified how basic research discoveries were being translated into methods to develop and improve, both agriculturally and environmentally, important crops. He praised that the Department of Botany at GCU, established in 1902, is the oldest Botany department in the entire sub-content which holds the distinction to publish the first research Journal "Biologia" in Pakistan in 1955.

Speakers at the concluding ceremony of the International Conference on Plant Sciences laid stress on research for effective utilization and conservation of indigenous plants species. Dr. Kun-Fang Cao from Guanxi University, China delivered his key note address on increasing hydraulic efficiency along with hydraulic safety and mechanic strength during the evolution of basal angiosperms. Prof. Dr. Job N., Nmadu from Nigeria said that Pakistani teachers had played a strong role in developing the education system in Nigeria. He lauded the hospitality of Pakistanis, saying they are a wonderful nation. Prof. Dr. Talok Singh Sahota from Canada also addressed the ceremony.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor said that knowledge was nothing without its application; these students worked very hard on their projects ranged from automation to power electronics to surveillance. He mentioned that market had become highly competitive, so the university graduates had to be highly innovative and technically sound to survive. Later, the fully automated lathe machine developed by the team of FAST University students secured the first position and cash award at the APEX 2018. Al-based home automation system of GCU students secured the second position.

GCU holds an International Conference On "Gender, Religion and Culture in Psychology

A three-day international conference on "Gender, Religion and Culture in Psychology: Issues Challenges and Prospects" was held at Government College University Lahore. The objective of the conference was to discuss that how theories developed in the west are being adopted in the Pakistani contest and how gaps in culturally embedded literature create room for research in non-western societies. The students and faculty members from 40 universities of Pakistan, seven illustrious researchers from UK, USA, Germany and Iran participated in the conference which was organized by the Psychology Department in collaboration with the federal and provincial higher education commissions.

Mr. Shafqat Mahmood, Federal Minister for Education was chief guest at the inauguration ceremony which was also addressed

The federal minister said that the importance of social sciences and humanities could not be ignored even in this age of science and technology. He mentioned that their government would increase budget for research besides establishing new universities. He proudly shared that he was an alumnus of Psychology Department of GCU, saying that he studied psychology for six years at the Government College Lahore and later taught for two years as a young lecturer.

The Vice Chancellor said that universities charters were needed to be reviewed as there were different clauses and rules of business that impeded the progress of higher education institutions. We have very high hopes from the present government that it would do for the education that was not done before. The Vice Chancellor mentioned that GCU had made it to the Times Higher Education World Universities Ranking for the first time last year due to the hard work and dedication of its faculty members. However, he stated that GCU would witness more rapid development in the coming years with the completion of its new campus at Kala Shah Kaku.

Dr. Jaime Diaz Granados explored how culture formed people's thoughts and behaviours and how psychological science could inform the ways that culture shaped people's self-concepts, perceptions, relationships, and moral reasoning.

The conference chairperson said that literature demonstrated that the psychology of gender and religion were knitted together in the local and national cultures as well. The conference covered the multiple issues related to religion, gender and culture and their relevance to subjective and psychological well-being in 20 scientific and one poster session.

Mathematical Workshop held at ASSMS-GCU

A Five-day mathematical workshop on "Advanced Topics in Mathematics" was held at the Abdus Salam School of Mathematical Sciences (ASSMS) in collaboration with the Punjab Higher Education Commission. Four eminent foreign Mathematicians, Dr. Shaun Cooper from Messy University New Zealand, Dr. Karl Dichler from Dalhousie University Canada, Dr. Simon Kristensen from Aarhus University Denmark and Dr. Mumtaz Hussain from La Trobe university Australia addressed the workshop which was attended by the students and faculty members from different universities across Pakistan.

The foreign speakers said that the Number Theory was one of the oldest and the most important branch of Mathematics but a serious dilemma was that the subject had been highly ignored in third world universities.

Prof. Dr. Hassan Amir Shah, the Vice Chancellor GCU appreciated the role of ASSMS for promotion of Mathematics in Pakistan. He expressed gratitude to the foreign speakers for their valuable time and asked them for their continuous support for further developments in mathematics in the country. The Vice Chancellor emphasized the serious need for arranging these kinds of workshops on unobserved areas like number theory more often.

Prof. Dr. Ghulam Murtaza, the Director General of ASSMS highlighted the history of number theory in the region. He mentioned that Government College happened to be a central hub of number theory during the headship (1936 - 1947) of famous number theorist, Prof. Sarvadaman Chawla. He also pledged that ASSMS would keep on organizing such thematic promising events for promoting mathematics in the country.

Sufi Literature Moot Begins at GCU

A two-day conference on "the role of Sufi literature in the promotion of peace and tolerance" held at the Government College University Lahore under the auspices of the Persian Department and Higher Education Commission.
